Chris Wilson is a current member of the NOA Board of Directors. She is a former board member and Past-President of the Association for Nursing Professional Development.

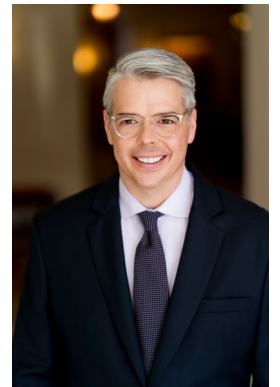

Dru Riddle, PhD, DNP, CRNA, FAAN

Dru is an Associate Professor and Director of Clinical Education at Texas Christian University School of Nurse Anesthesia, Fort Worth, Texas. As a board-certified CRNA, Dru maintains an active clinical anesthesia practice in Fort Worth, TX. He has served in multiple leadership roles in clinical and academic settings, currently as president of the American Association of Nurse Anesthesiology and as co-chair of the Cochrane US Network. Dru is the principal investigator on an externally funded Robert Wood Johnson Grant studying racial health equity. In 2023, he was appointed by Governor Abbott as a member of the Texas Board of Nursing.



Dru served as a CRNA in the United States Army Nurse Corps. He received his Bachelor of Science in Nursing degree from Virginia Commonwealth University, his Master of Science in Nursing with CRNA certification from Old Dominion University, his Doctor of Nursing Practice from Texas Christian University, and his PhD in nursing and pharmacogenomics from the Medical University of South Carolina.
