Chris Dellinger, MBA, BSN, RN, FAEN, is the 2024 Emergency Nurses Association president. She has served a total of six years on the board. Dellinger has spent nearly her entire career in emergency nursing as a staff nurse, charge nurse, coordinator, trauma services manager and state trauma surveyor. She is currently the director of Emergency, Trauma and ICU services. Dellinger earned her bachelor's degree in nursing from West Virginia University at Parkersburg in 2008 and later went on to complete her MBA with an emphasis in Health Care Administration from Salem University in 2017.
